things turn out. With non-stops flights to/from Bangkok, and two premium courses, Danang will make a great add-on destination for both Vietnam and Cambodia bound golf holidaymakers. Who would have believed that this central coastal region of Vietnam that was essentially the staging grounds for American troops during the Vietnam War would become the country's golfing oasis!

Malaysia

Jim and I just got back from Kuala Lumpur and what a trip it was. The Trent Jones designed Mines Golf Resort was probably the best course I have played in Asia with rolling hills and such a wide variety of shots that I had to use every club in my bag not once but twice. (Don't ask me my



score!) It is good that we can get visitors on this otherwise exclusive club because together with Saujana Country Club these 2 championship layouts make for some of the best golf for holidaymakers in any Asian city. What You Can Learn From Lucas Glovers US Open Win

Lucas Glover was determined not to end up on the list of final hole major-meltdowns. He weighed up his chances and played it safe on the 18th hole, hitting 6 iron off the tee and a 9 iron into the green to make Par. Most of those before him were ripping driver down to a yardage that becomes especially difficult to hit under pressure.

Next time you're faced with a pressure situation, take a moment extra to think about what options you have. If you only need a bogey to break 90, 80 or your personal best, you don't have to pull out the driver just because it's a Par 4. A couple of mid irons followed by a nice easy wedge would easily do the trick for most mid and high handicap golfers, yet how often is that seen? Yes, we are Tiger and Phil, and CAN hit the driver!

Next time you need to make a certain number on a hole, think Lucas Glover and play safe. You might not have anyone yelling "Get in the Hole", but you won't care after you're holding the trophy!
